Personal Development & College Admissions 101

The Princeton University Preparatory Program seeks outstanding graduate students, college admissions professionals, counselors and/or local teachers to join our summer faculty for our 2019 Summer Institute. PUPP is a comprehensive academic and cultural enrichment program for high-achieving, low-income high school students from Ewing, Lawrence, Nottingham, Princeton and Trenton High Schools. PUPP works with high school students beginning the summer after their 9th grade year and continuing through high school graduation. Our goal is to prepare our scholars for success at selective colleges and universities. The cornerstone of PUPP is a six-and-a-half week Summer Institute on the Princeton campus. Summer academic courses range from literature and writing to college preparation and laboratory science. A range of university-affiliated faculty, staff and graduate students, as well as classroom teachers and counselors from the region serve as PUPP faculty. In addition, the Summer Institute includes a leadership retreat, college visits and trips to museums and cultural institutions. The 2019 Summer Institute planning begins in March 2019 and the institute runs from late June through mid-August.

Rising Sophomores – Personal Development

The Personal Development course launches PUPP Scholars into an exploration of their learning styles, areas of personal strength and areas for development, as well as helping them develop their public speaking skills, general communication skills and the habits of mind of successful students. Starting with a reading of the text, *Seven Habits of Highly Effective Teens*, the course challenges scholars to develop a personal mission statement, try new approaches to problem solving and relationships, and identify their goals and commitments as they move forward in high school and into young adulthood.

Rising Seniors – College Admissions 101

The College Admissions 101 course is a cap-stone course for PUPP Scholars that leads them through the complexities of the college admissions process. The course provides a step-by-step structure to help scholars develop their college lists, understand the differences in range and type of college and university (public, private, urban, rural, etc.), as well as prepare applications, essays, and other material for the college process. Special guest speakers, college fairs and mock interviews are also part of the course.

The objectives of the College Admissions 101 course are four fold:


- Explore the college admissions process (college choices, fields of study, applications, fit, etc.)
- Prepare the “Common Application” for senior year submission
- Develop short essay responses to college application questions
- Prepare a “College admissions portfolio” with application information, timeline, transcript, essays, résumé and other related materials

The 2019 PUPP Summer Institute runs from June 20 through August 2, 2019, with planning meetings held throughout the spring. Each cohort has classes that meet for 90 minutes, twice weekly, with a few additional class sessions, excursions and special events throughout the summer. There is an existing curriculum/structure for the course, but it is open to development/interpretation by the instructor.
